Asian Association for the Study of Diabetes (AASD) Awards are made to honor substantial contributions to the mission of AASD: Promoting Research for Better Diabetes Care in Asia. Recipients are individuals who by their outstanding leadership and career achievements in diabetes research, clinical care and education have enriched diabetes care in our region and worldwide.

The Yutaka Seino Distinguished Leadership Award

The AASD's highest honor recognizes the lifetime achievements and exceptional contributions of an individual to Diabeteology in Asia.

Criteria for Selection:

- Nominees demonstrate long-term leadership in research and education to advance diabetes care in Asia. Publications and teaching experience are the primary considerations in the selection process.

Award/Lecture/Publication:

- Recipients deliver the Yutaka Seino Award Lecture at the annual Scientific Sessions.
- The Award Lecture will be published in the Journal of Diabetes Investigation (JDI).

Honorarium/Award:

- Presentation of the Award at the Annual Scientific Meeting.
- The recipient receives a \$10,000 honorarium, a certificate plaque, complimentary registration fees and travel expenses.

Nomination/Submission Process:

- Nominations must be submitted using the AASD Award Application Form.
- Nominations are accepted only from AASD members including AASD executive board members.
- Letters of nomination of less than 400 words and signed by three persons at most will be accepted.
- CV with nominees' career and publication highlights (not more than ten publications relevant to the prize criteria).

The Masato Kasuga Award for Outstanding Scientific Achievement

An AASD award presented to a young investigator in recognition of meritorious accomplishments in the field of diabetes and related metabolic diseases in Asia.

Criteria for Selection:

- Nominees have outstanding scientific achievements in diabetes-related research.
- Nominees are less than 46 years of age and are actively engaged in diabetes-related research.

Award/Lecture/Publication:

- Recipients deliver the Masato Kasuga Award Lecture at the annual Scientific Sessions.
- The Award lecture will be published in the Journal of Diabetes Investigation (JDI).

Honorarium/Award:

- Presentation of the Award at the Annual Scientific Meeting.
- The recipient receives a \$5,000 honorarium, a certificate plaque, complimentary registration fees and travel expenses.

Nomination/Submission Process:

- Nominations must be submitted using the AASD Award Application Form.
- Nominations are accepted only from AASD members including AASD executive board members.
- Letters of nomination of less than 400 words and signed by three persons at most will be accepted.

- Recipients deliver the Pan Xiaoren Distinguished Research Award Lecture at the annual Scientific Sessions.
- The Award lecture will be published in the Journal of Diabetes Investigation (JDI).

Honorarium/Award:

- Presentation of the Award at the Annual Scientific Meeting.
- The recipient receives a \$5,000 honorarium, a certificate plaque, complimentary registration fees and travel expenses.
